

“Contact mapping” – A collective autoethnography in times of the COVID-19 pandemic

During the *SFUrope pre-conference* we collectively designed the research project “Contact mapping”. By using the method of collective autoethnography and during 6–10 weeks, we document and reflect on the social and affective qualities of our contacts to others in the light of social and/or physical distancing and contact tracing. After 10 weeks all project members will meet again and discuss, compare and collectively interpret these results. Conjoined by analysis, these data enable us to design “transnational contact maps”, which display the multiplicity of social and affective interactions in times of overlapping crisis. These maps will be introduced at the SFUrope Autumn School (2022) and further developed by the participants.
